Is Finding New Life

2,440 came to faith through InterVarsity this year.

We are celebrating each person who moved closer to Jesus.

Thousands of students heard the gospel through InterVarsity, many of them for the first time. We rejoice that so many Gen Z students defied expectations, choosing Jesus and his example for their lives. This was a 33% increase in new believers over last year.

Campuses Are Waiting

Actively working to reach tribal colleges, HBCUs, and community colleges.

Today there are two million students enrolled at schools who have no access to a campus-based Christian community. Many are community colleges, tribal colleges, HBCUs, and other state and private schools. There are a variety of reasons these places are unreached; some are in remote locations, some lack local churches able to support ministry. InterVarsity is working to recruit and train skilled campus ministers who are motivated by their love for students and willing to relocate. Once reached, students in these places often respond with great openness to the gospel. They are just waiting for someone to be sent.

124 ministries praying to reach Every Campus.

In 2018, InterVarsity and Cru began a strategic partnership to help establish a gospel movement on every college campus without one. The EveryCampus movement was born. There are now over 124 ministries praying and coordinating their efforts, and together we've seen the number of campuses with no known ministry decline from 1,142 to 683 over the last five years.

InterVarsity helped form over 5,000 faithful student leaders this year from Hawaii to New England.

We're working to meet the need for faithful leaders by investing in promising students who are leading on their campuses now, and who will lead the church in the years ahead.

InterVarsity seeks to form faithful student leaders, equipped to lead with humility and integrity. We offered our National Leadership Institute in June this year to a select cohort of high-potential student leaders from across the fellowship.

In addition, 10,446 students attended conferences and 3,368 attended camps where they experienced spiritual refreshment, leadership training, and made deeper connections with God and with their community.

InterVarsity's programs, camps, and conferences reached 62,311 students and faculty this year.



704 campuses had an established InterVarsity chapter.



9,581 students and faculty met for regular campus prayer meetings.



2,440 students and faculty made first time decisions to follow Jesus (+33% over last year!).



4,456 students went on transformative, cross-cultural discipleship and missions experiences this year.



2,640 weekly small group Bible studies were led by 5,000 student leaders across the country (+9% over last year).



25,884 core students attended more than 50% of their InterVarsity chapter activities (+11% over last year).

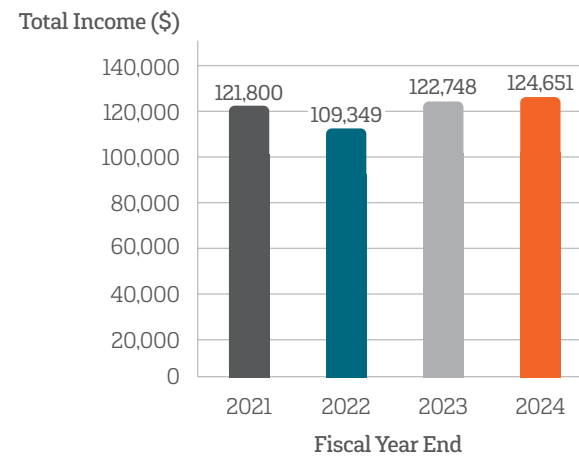

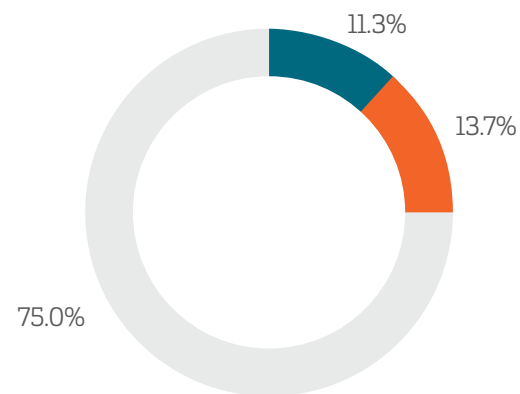

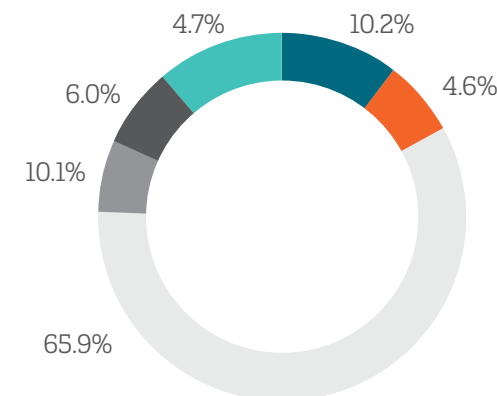

This year we welcomed 114 new InterVarsity staff to minister to students and faculty.

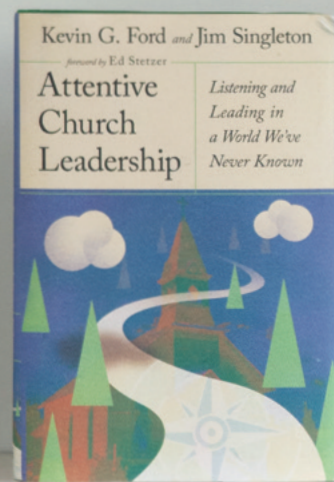
