To advance the purpose of InterVarsity and the Graduate Faculty Ministries, this position will provide leadership and facilitate the work among graduate international students and faculty.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES

Personal:

Be a maturing disciple of Jesus Christ: growing in love for God, God's word, God's people of every ethnicity and culture, and God's purposes in the world.

Lead the national development of International Student Ministries (ISM) among graduate students and faculty:

- Set vision, direction, and goals for ISM in partnership with the GFM Leadership Team (GFMLT)
- Complete a thorough annual assessment of ISM growth and development for GFMLT and ISM Department
- Serve as a member of the GFM Focused Ministries Team
- Act as an ambassador and liaison between ISM Department and GFM and serve on the ISM national team
- Work in consultation with the ISM National Director in advancing international student work in GFM

Support the development of ISM work in the field:

- Increase ministry to internationals by working in partnership with Staff Directors to build and plant strong ISM-specific chapters on strategic campuses and to create a welcoming environment within non-ISM specific GFM chapters; partner with staff to identify best practices for both types of groups
- Provide training, coaching and modeling to equip GFM staff to serve internationals in ISM-specific communities and non-ISM chapters
- Support the work of GFM Regional Directors (RDs) and Area Directors (ADs) and National Ministry Coordinators to recruit, appoint, place and train staff who will work with international students and faculty (ISM National Director has secondary input for hiring)
- Assist RDs and ADs in setting and evaluating ministry goals for ISM work
- Enhance the proclamation and demonstration of the gospel among international students and faculty
- Encourage GFM staff to engage in strategic participation in other InterVarsity and national ISM events to enhance ministry growth and effectiveness

Perform the necessary administrative tasks required to fulfill the purpose of InterVarsity and comply with InterVarsity's policies and procedures:

- Provide administrative services and financial management that enable staff to fulfill their assignments
- Maintain strong partnerships with the National Service Center personnel
- Ensure adherence to national policies, procedures, reporting requirements, and financial guidelines

Maintain sound financial status of GFM International Student Ministry through management of budgeting, ministry partnership development, and expense control in accordance with current guidelines:

- Secure personal financial and prayer support
- Prepare budgets for International Student Ministry staff and programs
- Approve expense reports
- Raise strategic funds for ISM and GFM nationally in partnership with National Advancement Officers as needed

Establish and maintain public relations on behalf of ISM in GFM:

- Resource the National and GFM ISM Ministry web sites in areas related to graduate student and faculty ministry
- Cultivate a network of strategic relationships within the academy, churches, and other appropriate organizations to cultivate learning and advance ISM
- Accept appropriate speaking engagements, both internal and external

- Two or more years of experience with international student ministry required
- At least two years of experience with GFM strongly preferred

- Ability to build partnerships and work collaboratively with others inside and outside InterVarsity
- Vision for the development of ISM in GFM

- Understanding of the university and professional worlds and ability to enter their networks
- Good oral and written communication skills
- Ability to raise funds and manage finances for personal budget and national priorities
- Agreement with the mission of GFM

Frame of Reference

All staff members subscribe annually to the Purpose Statement of InterVarsity:

In response to God's love, grace and truth: The purpose of InterVarsity Christian Fellowship/USA is to establish and advance at colleges and universities witnessing communities of students and faculty who follow Jesus as Savior and Lord: growing in love for God, God's Word, God's people of every ethnicity and culture and God's purposes in the world.

This purpose is admittedly more limited than the Great Commission. As a mission extension of the local church, we have adopted boundaries on our activities based on our call to serve a defined group of God's people. Within the context of InterVarsity's purpose, all of the relationships and tasks that staff members engage in as part of their work for InterVarsity have both eternal and temporal components.

Values:

InterVarsity is committed to developing men and women from diverse cultures, backgrounds, and generations, whom God calls to work with us for both shorter and longer periods of service, as we pursue the call of God in the university world.

Maturing Disciple of Jesus Christ:

Every InterVarsity staff member is to be a maturing disciple of the Lord Jesus Christ, growing in obedience to the Scriptures. The marks of a long-term love relationship with Christ in the fullness of His Spirit are described in Galatians 5:22: "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control." In the workplace, this fruit is revealed in healthy working relationships which encourage all staff to accomplish their work and enhance their focus on the spiritual aspects of their work.

Team Work:

Each individual staff person is a vital member of Christ's body. This means that we will work with one another in ways that honor and encourage all to grow in Christ while accomplishing His work. Our community requires that each individual serve as a team member in a collegial and open environment based on values, relationships, and vision as well as structure and position.

We engage in learning and biblical reflection in every area of life and seek a unity of knowledge and practice, because the God whom we worship is Creator of all. We labor to form leaders in every field who honor God's gifts and calling. We believe that the integrity of these pursuits will be a witness of his Kingdom to the academic and professional worlds.
