MAIN FOCUS | Believe that students are the experts for their context. Cultivate their ideas.

15 MINUTE SESSION | 3 parts

- 3. Coaching Form: After each coaching conversation, fill out the online form with information about what you covered. Students will take their canvases home with them.

Good coaches: Help students make a clear, simple and compelling vision statement that resonates with who they are and the need that they are seeing.

Help the student brainstorm connections in their network.

Great coaches: Encourage the student to pursue the vision as an adventure, not a project. They trust in Jesus' ongoing leadership of the student.

Help the student see their whole network as a web of Godgiven relationships, and help the student discern where God is already at work.
